



Live Well San Diego Top 10 Indicators Annual Progress Update October 2017

Live Well San Diego is an ambitious, long-term vision that involves everyone – not just County government – working together to promote healthy, safe and thriving communities.

How progress will be measured: The *Live Well San Diego* Indicators are part of a framework that spans across five areas of influence: **Health, Knowledge, Standard of Living, Community** and **Social**, which influence well-being across the lifespan of an individual. The *Live Well San Diego* Indicators, introduced in October 2013, allow the County of San Diego to connect a wide array of programs and activities to measure improvements in the health, safety and well-being of every resident.

What we will learn: We will compare current year data* to baseline data, revealing if we are moving in the right direction, or if more efforts are needed to change course. We will also evaluate and compare the county-wide data against state and national levels.



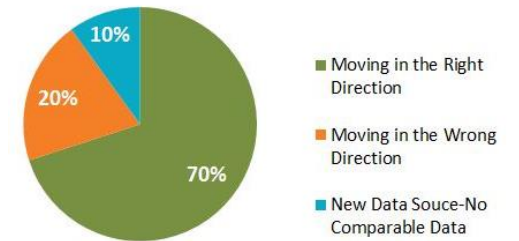
Live Well San Diego Indicators — Current Year Compared To Baseline:

- Seven leading indicators moved in the right direction - **Life Expectancy, Education, Income, Security, Physical Environment, Community Involvement** and **Unemployment Rate****
- Two leading indicators moved in the wrong direction - **Quality of Life** and **Vulnerable Populations**
- One indicator was updated to a new and more reliable source- **Built Environment**

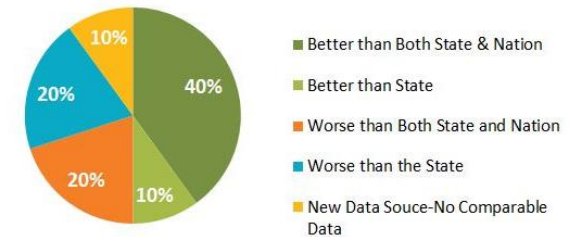
Live Well San Diego Indicators — San Diego County Compared to the State and Nation:

- We are doing better than both the state and nation for four leading indicators - **Life Expectancy, Security, Community Involvement** and **Unemployment Rate****
- We are doing better than the state for one leading indicator - **Education**
- We are doing worse than both the state and nation for two leading indicators - **Quality of Life** and **Income**
- We are doing worse than the state for two leading indicators – **Physical Environment** and **Vulnerable Populations**
- No comparable state and national data - **Built Environment**
