


COVID-19 and Influenza Fiscal Year-to-Date Overview



COVID-19 Community Levels


Levels represent COVID-19

Children and COVID-19: State-Level Data Report




- For the week ending on April 20th, about 9,000 COVID-19 cases were reported among children and teens.
 - Approximately 15.5 million children have tested positive for COVID-19 since the beginning of the pandemic.
 - Children represent 18% of all COVID-19 cases.
- Only 32.9% of 5–11-year-olds and 61.8% of 12–17year-olds have completed their primary COVID-19 vaccine series.



NEW VACCINATION RECOMMENDATIONS



WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW!

- Everyone aged 6 years and older should get 1 updated Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine to be considered up to date.
- People aged 65 years and older may get a 2nd updated Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna COVID-19 booster dose.
- People who are moderately or severely immunocompromised may get additional updated Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna COVID-19 booster doses.
- Children aged 6 months—5 years may need multiple doses of COVID-19 vaccine to be up to date, including at least 1 updated dose of Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine, depending on the number of doses they've previously received and their age.

- Inspired by the COVID-19 <u>Our Health Deserves a Shot</u> and <u>Our Health Deserves a Boost(er)</u> Youth Challenges
- Purpose: Part of the Youth Sector and BHS Fentanyl and Naloxone Awareness Campaign to conduct overdose prevention education
- **Goal:** Encourage awareness and education on the illicit fentanyl crisis and benefits of naloxone, while engaging youth and social media platforms.

CHALLENGES

In 2020, COVID caused us to pause the monthly Health Fair for several months. We moved from SDCCE (ECC campus) to the local IRYMCA. The relocation, along with the lingering COVID pandemic, caused a decrease in the # of participants from 600-800 to 150-300/month.

GOALS

Expand our outreach to increase the participants each month.


Continue to improve the overall health of our community. Add additional services like vision, dental screening, etc.


Summary


