About the Framework

As a school improvement strategy, community school initiatives enable the local education agency (LEA) and school to work closely with educators, students, and families to understand and address the unique needs, assets, and aspirations of the school community. Community schooling is an equity-enhancing strategy that aligns with and can help coordinate and extend a wide range of state, school, and district initiatives. This framework is the foundation for California's community schools strategy.

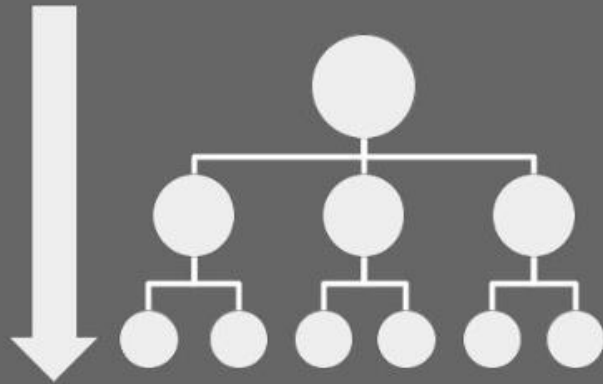

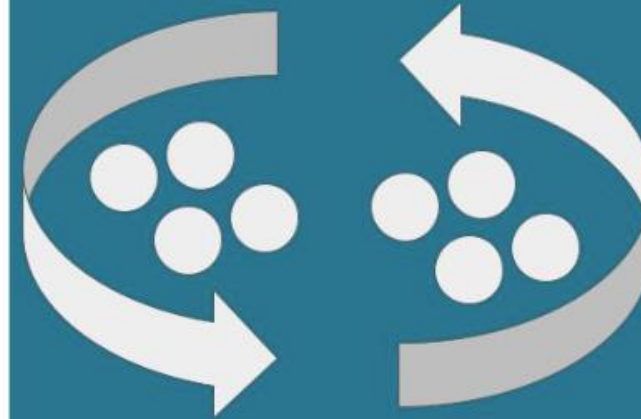
