Health Education, Blood Pressure	Health Education: Pharmacists from Medical Care Services (MCS), County of San Diego Health & Human Services Agency can offer comprehensive health education that provides essential insights, tips, and valuable learning experiences to empower the community to live healthy, thriving lives.
